The different kinds of **pronouns** are:

- <u>Personal Pronouns</u> are pronouns that refers to the person or thing preforming the action
  - You are going to the store.
  - They are going to sleep.
- are pronouns that refers to non-specific beings,
   objects, or places
  - Everyone is going on the trip.
  - Is someone going to help me clean the house?
- Demonstrative Pronouns refer to specific things, people or beings
  - That is a nice car.
  - This is my coat.
- <u>Reflexive Pronouns</u> are pronouns used when when sentence has the same subject and object.
  - I baked the cake myself.
  - We fixed the care ourselves.

- <u>Interrogative Pronouns</u> are used to ask a question
  - Who is going to the store?
  - · What are you doing?
