## Pronouns

**Pronouns** replace the noun. A pronoun can be used as the subject of the sentence or the object of the sentence. Most of the time a pronoun refers to something already mentioned or understood by the listener or reader.

The different kinds of **pronouns** are:

- **Personal Pronouns** - are pronouns that refers to the person or thing performing the action
  - **You** are going to the store.
  - **They** are going to sleep.
- **Indefinite Pronouns** - are pronouns that refers to non-specific beings, objects, or places
  - **Everyone** is going on the trip.
  - Is **someone** going to help me clean the house?
- **Demonstrative Pronouns** - refer to specific things, people or beings
  - **That** is a nice car.
  - **This** is my coat.
- **Reflexive Pronouns** - are pronouns used when when sentence has the same subject and object.
  - I baked the cake **myself**.
  - We fixed the care **ourselves**.

- Interrogative Pronouns - are used to ask a question
  - Who is going to the store?
  - What are you doing?
