Pronouns

Pronouns replace the noun. A pronoun can be used as the subject of the sentence or the object of the sentence. Most of the time a pronoun refers to something already mentioned or understood by the listener or reader.

The different kinds of **pronouns** are:

• <u>Personal Pronouns</u> - are pronouns that refers to the person or thing preforming the action

- You are going to the store.
- They are going to sleep.

• <u>Indefinite Pronouns</u> - are pronouns that refers to non-specific beings, objects, or places

- Everyone is going on the trip.
- Is **someone** going to help me clean the house?

• **Demonstrative Pronouns** - refer to specific things, people or beings

- That is a nice car.
- This is my coat.

• **<u>Reflexive Pronouns</u>** - are pronouns used when when sentence has the same subject and object.

- I baked the cake myself.
- We fixed the care **ourselves**.

• Interrogative Pronouns - are used to ask a question

•Who is going to the store?

•What are you doing?
