Singular Countable Nouns

Singular Countable Nouns - A determiner is used before the noun or the noun phrase. The following types of determiners are used before the nouns:

Possessive Pronouns - such as my, his, ours, whose etc

- This is **my** dog.
- We live in **our** house.
- This is **her** bag.

Articles - a, an & the

- I want **a** dog from **the** local animal shelter.
- We do not want **the** book.
- Did you ever have **an** elephant?

Numbers - only the number "one" can be used

- We have **one** car.
- The girls have **one** brother.
- My dog has **one** water bowl.
